August 18, 2026

I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Welcome

Akroyd called meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

B. Roll Call and Announcement of a Quorum

Akroyd announced a quorum.

C. Agenda Approval

No changes made to agenda.

II. PUBLIC REQUEST TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. Any member of the public who requests to address the Board on any item which is not on the agenda may do so at this time. Any matter that requires action by the Board will be referred to the staff for action or staff will be asked to report back to the Board at a subsequent meeting. Comments pertaining to scheduled agenda items will be heard when that item is discussed by the Board. Comments are limited to three minutes per person unless further time is granted by the presiding officer.

Randi Olson – Cresta Way resident

Security is still not closing the park at dusk consistently. Setting the sprinklers to go on at dusk would help to timely clear and close Cresta Park.

III. CONSENT AGENDA

- A. Approval of the minutes of the Board Meeting held on July 21, 2026
Shetty motioned to approve the minutes of the July 21, 2026 Board Meeting with the addition of the sentence “We do plan to engage community” in section IV.C. in the 2nd paragraph of Public Comments. Weatherford seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

Weatherford motioned to approve the Financial Reports, seconded by Lemmon. Motion carried unanimously, 5-0.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Consideration and possible action to approve the Park Ordinance Revision

Changes made to the Park Ordinance include prohibiting fire in the park unless in an authorized and installed device, outlawing fireworks, standardizing the general manager title, and clarifying the rental insurance policy.

Public comments:

- **Randi Olson – wants to confirm the change in park hours.**
- **A change in park hours was not part of the revision as those changes were adopted in a prior board meeting.**

Nora motioned to approve the Park Ordinance Revision, seconded by Erickson. Motion carried unanimously, 5-0.

V. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Consideration and possible action to approve an engagement letter with Larry P, Bain, CPA for audit services

- **The Board raised possible concerns about the length of time that Mr. Bain has served as our auditor. A suggestion was made to research best practices for auditor engagement and rotation.**
- **Phillips will reach out to our attorney and to trade organizations such as CSDA and Prism to gather information on best practices for auditor retention.**
- **After reviewing the information, a decision can be made on whether to proceed with the audit as scheduled or hire a new auditor.**
- **Phillips will discuss the separation of duties issue that was raised in our last audit, along with possible remedies, with whomever is selected to perform our FY 25/26 audit.**

Lemmon motioned to sign engagement letter upon a positive phone call to trade organizations regarding best practices, seconded by Erickson. Motion approved unanimously, 5-0.

- B. Discussion and possible action regarding process to fill the short term Board position due to a lack of candidate filings for the November 2026 election.

- **Phillips clarified the appointment procedure for the 4 open Board positions that were set to be filled in the November election.**
- **1 candidate each filed nomination paperwork for each of the 3 open full-term positions, all incumbents. These positions will therefore not show on the ballot.**
- **The 1 short-term position will be appointed by the County Board of Supervisors. Our Board can recommend someone to fill the position. The current incumbent, Lauren Erickson, expressed interest in continuing to serve on the Board.**

Weatherford motioned to recommend that the County Board of Supervisors appoint Lauren Erickson to the short-term Board seat, seconded by Shetty. Motion carried 4-0, with Erickson abstaining from the vote.

VI. REPORTS

A. Staff Report

- **2 successful events were held this past month, the Arden Bark Dog Show and the Hot Arden Nights Car Show. Enrolled cars at the car show doubled from the prior car show held two years ago.**
- **Our summer programming has concluded, except for a few more days of Adult Lap Swim.**
- **Additional enrollment was made possible in our Before and After School programs by increasing our van trips, but wait lists remain.**
- **Capital projects are progressing; the parking lot is scheduled to be repaired, coated, and striped next week, and new security cameras will be installed at Cresta Park tomorrow.**
- **An end-of-summer thank you brunch was held for staff.**
- **Phillips attended a Cresta Park Neighborhood Watch gathering.**

B. Security Report

- **Calls for Service and Outliers are reported in the agenda packet.**
- **A letter was received from a concerned resident about large user groups in our parks that are gathering without permits. Phillips responded to letter with an explanation of park usage policies.**

- **Neighbor concerns were raised regarding late park closures at Cresta Park. Phillips explained the directive given to our security company: Cresta Park is to be closed at dusk, followed by Arden Park. A review of closure times shows a 75% on time closure rate at Cresta, with the weak link found to be officers that fill in for our regular patrol officer on his days off. Phillips will address this finding with our security company.**
- **Resident Olson expressed her appreciation for staff not approving the Mariemont Meet and Greet at Cresta Park.**

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
THE ARDEN PARK RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT
RECOMMENDING TO THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AN
APPOINTMENT TO THE DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

WHEREAS, the Arden Park Recreation and Park District (the “District”) is a political subdivision of the State of California and an independent special district formed and operated pursuant to the provisions of Public Resources Code Section 5780 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, a general district election for members of the District’s Board of Directors is scheduled for November 3, 2026; and

WHEREAS, for one of the positions up for election, no person timely filed a Declaration of Candidacy for such office with the Sacramento County Elections Office in the manner and the time periods prescribed in the Uniform District Election Law, including the incumbent, who inadvertently missed the time deadline for such filing because of necessary out-of-state business; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 10515 provides that if no person timely files a Declaration of Candidacy for an elective office to be filled in an election, the County election official shall file a certificate attesting to that fact with the County Board of Supervisors and request that the Board of Supervisors, at a regular or special meeting held prior to the Monday before the first Friday in December in which the election is held, appoint any person to the office who is qualified on the date when the election would have been held. The person appointed shall qualify and take office and serve exactly as if elected at a general district election for the office; and

WHEREAS, in light of the power of the District’s Board of Directors to appoint any qualified person to fill any vacant position occurring on the District’s Board of Directors pursuant to Government Code Section 1780, and the interests of members of the Board of Directors and their constituents in serving with persons who are knowledgeable and familiar with District policies, procedures and operations, the District Board of Directors finds it appropriate and useful that it make a recommendation to the County Board of Supervisors of a qualified individual to appoint as a member of this District’s Board of Directors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE ARDEN PARK RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. Recommendation for Appointment

After deliberation, the District Board of Directors recommends to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors that they exercise their power of appointment pursuant to Elections Code

Section 10515 to appoint as a member of the District Board of Directors LAUREN ERICKSON. Ms. Erickson is the current incumbent in this position and has served effectively since her appointment to the Board of Directors on January 20, 2026. She was unable to timely file her Declaration of Candidacy for this position, but is interested and desires to continue to serve as a member of the District's Board of Directors for a new term.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the officers and staff of District are hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things, and execute and deliver any and all documents which in consultation with District Counsel they may deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution, and any and all such actions previously taken by such officers or staff members are hereby ratified and confirmed.

2. Effective Date

This Resolution will take effect upon its adoption.

Events

- Tents in Town will be held September 12th -13th, with 199 enrollees and counting. Local Boy Scouts will be on hand to help with food distribution, games, and s'mores making.
- Music in the Park is scheduled for September 19th, featuring the band Busy Being Famous.
- Our final Movie in the Park of the year is scheduled for October 2nd, featuring the movie *G.O.A.T.*
- Our biggest event of the year, Fall Festival, is happening on October 17th. Plans are well underway. The petting zoo, bounce houses, beer garden, and DJ are booked, we have several craft vendors lined up, and the planning meeting with our event partner Mariemont Elementary is scheduled for September 14th.

Programs

- A new youth program, Soccer Conditioning, is underway with our newest contract instructor.
- Our Adults Night Out program expanded its offerings to include a Halloween-themed Trivia Night on October 16th in addition to regular Bingo Nights.

Capital Projects/Expenditures

- The parking lot repair, paving and striping project, the concrete repair project, and the Cresta Park camera installation were all completed timely and within budget.

Parks and Maintenance

- The new utility vehicle for Maintenance staff was delivered on September 9th.
- Meetings were held with 2 sign vendors to assist with new park rules signs.
- GM will be meeting next month with a landscaping and irrigation specialist to discuss a workable maintenance plan for Cresta Park.

- The change in park closing hours to dusk may have implications for our security budget. As closing times get earlier, especially when clocks return to standard time, CSA will not be able to combine the Cresta Park closure with their nightly neighborhood patrol.

Staff Updates

- GM attended the Arden Park Neighborhood Association BBQ, meeting both new and long-time Arden Park residents.
- GM attended a Selling Surplus webinar presented by GovDeals, a government surplus liquidity marketplace.
- GM received a scholarship funding her \$825 registration fee for the upcoming CSDA Board Clerk conference.

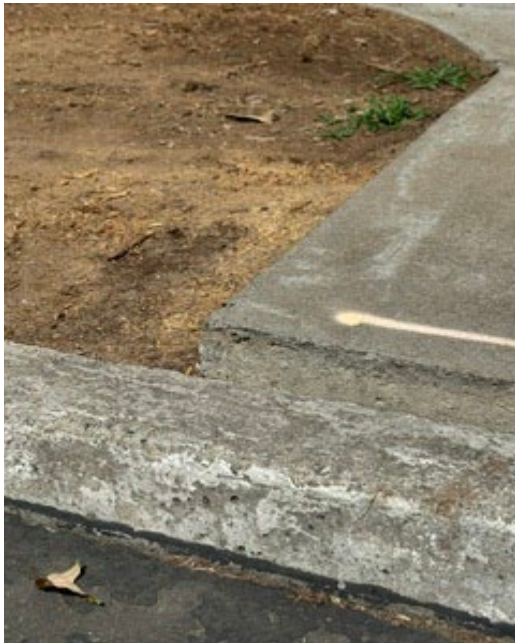
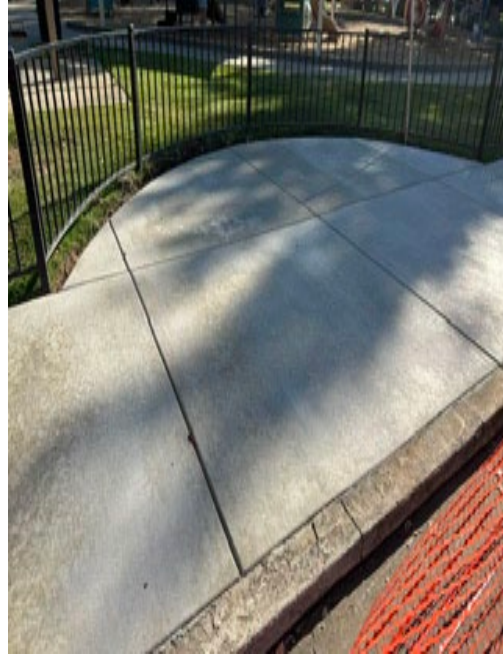
